



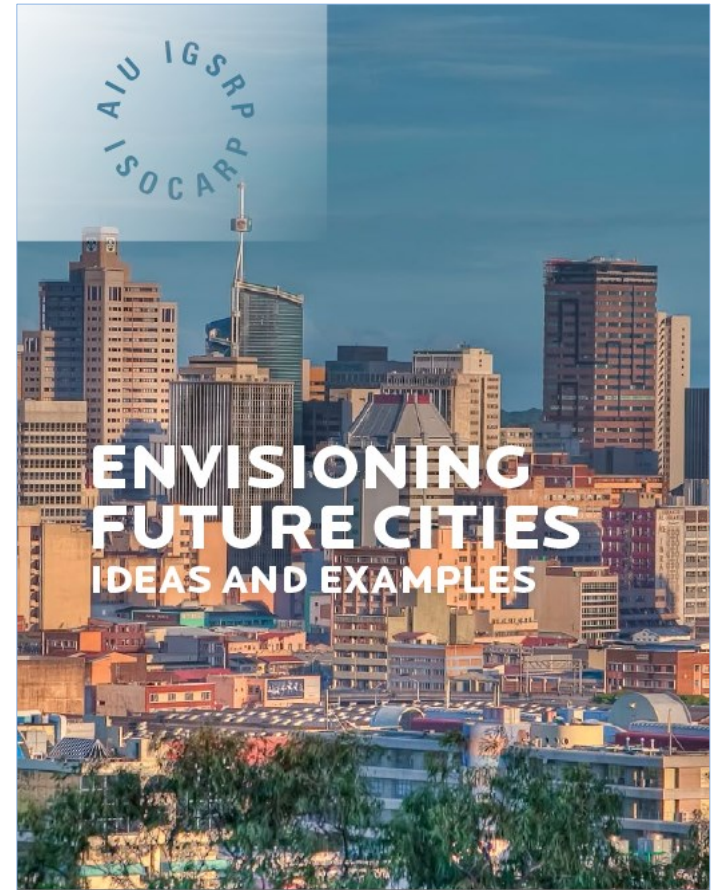

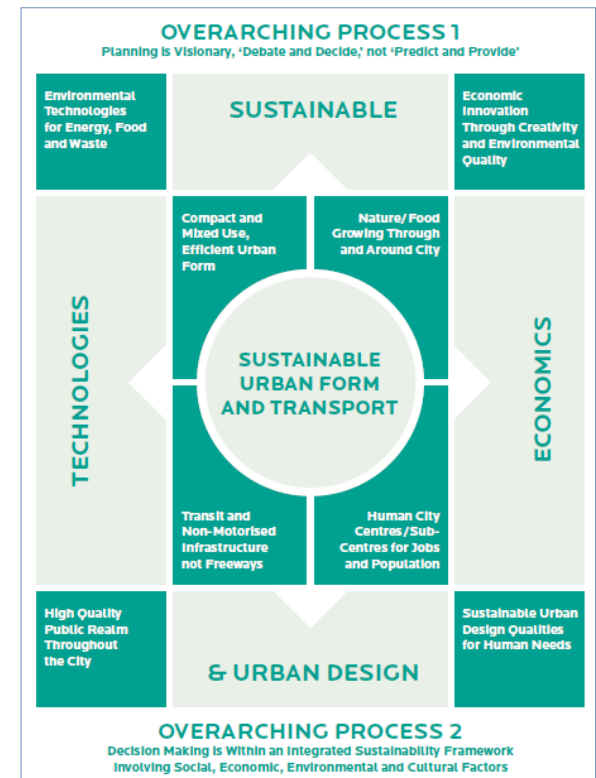
# Organization of the Book
