**Young Planning Professionals (YPP) – Young Professionals' Think Deep Program (YPTDP) Workshop – Glasgow 2016**

**Rethinking the Clyde Waterfront**  
**Connecting the infrastructure development into integrated above and below ground urban design for the brownfields redevelopment schemes**

**Glasgow, United Kingdom, 23-28 October 2016**

**CALL for WORKSHOP TUTORS**

**BACKGROUND**

ISOCARP in partnership with ITACUS have recently made an agreement with Glasgow City Council (GCC) which entails a **Young Planning Professionals (YPP) – Young Professional' Think Deep Program (YPTDP) Workshop**, intended for both British and international young planners and underground space specialists. The workshop aims to become a first in a series of events, leading towards producing a set of case studies contributing towards in-depth analysis of interrelations between city planning focusing on urban design and underground space utilization and infrastructure provision.

This workshop is at the same time a part of the ISOCARP's Young Planning Professionals' Program, which since 1991 brings together young professional urban planners from all parts of the world. The YPP Workshops provide an opportunity to work together as a closely-knit team. The workshops are hands-on and aimed at establishing a good working relationship with young colleagues from all parts of the world, while working towards results in a very short period of time. Within the framework of the **YPP / YPTDP Workshop** it is intended to bring together a group of 20 Young Professionals (up to 35 years old), both of British origin and coming from overseas. This group shall include **10 urban designers / planners / architects and 10 civil engineers / underground space specialists (such as geologists, hydrogeologists, tunnel and geotechnical engineers).**



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#### **OBJECTIVES AND THEME OF THE WORKSHOP:**

The workshop aims to provide young planners and underground space specialists responsible for, or participating in, the shaping and development of cities, with the principles and practices of effective contemporary urbanism with special focus on interrelations between above and below ground urban design, to above ground quality of place, connectedness, land use, as well as underground space utilization and infrastructure provision.

The objective of the workshop is to provide the workshop participants with hands-on practical experiences. YPs work in a studio setting under the **guidance of three experts** from members of ISOCARP and ITACUS on a project site chosen jointly by ISOCARP, ITACUS and representatives of the local partners from Glasgow City Council. They will be accompanied by the ISOCARP Vice President responsible for the YPP program as well as an ITACUS representative for the entire duration of their stay in Glasgow. The site focus of the workshop is a key development area for Glasgow, and the workshop outputs will provide examples for the comprehensive (strategic) urban redevelopment approaches for the site which the host city can endorse or take on. Understanding brownfield development using comprehensive and volumetric approaches is a key current topic for the city that has been undertaking redevelopment processes in last decades.

The theme of the workshop is in line with the aims of other major regeneration plans of the city. The Clyde Waterfront site was one of the pioneer areas leading Glasgow prosperity in 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century, famous for its industrial heritage. Once a vibrant port and maritime industry area, Clyde Waterfront is currently under deterioration and needs regeneration and redevelopment. This was also indicated in the Glasgow City Plan as the site was pointed out as one of the priority development area. At the same time first improvements took place within its boundaries, including iconic public buildings contributing towards the creation of the new image of the site.

#### **AUDIENCE:**

The workshop is targeted at junior British and international professionals (up to 35 years old). They come from various backgrounds such as spatial planning, architecture, civil engineering and real estate management. Most of them have professional degrees and a few years of practice. It is intended that the workshop will gather 20 YPs, **including 10 urban designers / planners / architects and 10 civil engineers / underground space specialists (such as geologists, hydrogeologists, tunnel and geotechnical engineers).**



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## **REQUIREMENTS FOR THE WORKSHOP TUTORS:**

### Professional profiles of prospect tutors:

It is intended to select 3 workshop tutors, 2 of which shall represent urban design / urban planning / architecture disciplines and 1 – civil engineering (with background in infrastructure design). Since the workshop has an interdisciplinary character, the organizers seek candidates with complementary professional profiles allowing fulfilling the workshop objectives.

### Tasks of the three selected tutors:

1. Be responsible for the co-ordination of the framework, the scientific and professional content of the Workshop Theme in collaboration with local tutors from GCC.
2. Guide the young planners' and underground space specialists' work throughout the workshop, stimulate discussions among them, instruct on the presentation format.
3. Coordinate the publication of the Workshop results in collaboration with the VP responsible for the YPP Program.

## **CONTRIBUTION AND EXPENSES:**

The call for **WORKSHOP COORDINATORS** is open to ISOCARP and ITACUS **Members only**.

### Tasks:

Each tutor will spend 5 ½ days working with the YPP group from 23 to 28<sup>October</sup> 2016. Before and after, there may be a necessity of conducting meetings with local hosts and press. **Therefore, tutors shall arrive 23 October in the early afternoon the latest (possibly before 3 pm) and depart not earlier than 28 October in the early afternoon (possibly after 3 pm).**

### Honorarium:

There will be no honorarium for the Workshop tutors for the duration of time they will spend guiding the YPs.

### Expenses:

ISOCARP will provide the **international / domestic travel allowance (up to 500 Euro for the round-trip and other associated costs)** for the selected tutors. The tickets shall be purchased by the tutors themselves. Also, accommodation, local transportation and full board will be provided on site by GCC. These expenses will be refunded by ISOCARP office on the basis of original receipts and boarding passes. **ALL ADDITIONAL COSTS HAVE TO BE MET BY TUTORS BY THEMSELVES. ISOCARP HAS A LIMITED BUDGET FOR THIS ASSIGNMENT.** ISOCARP will provide reimbursement forms, which shall be filled to get the



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refund after completion of the task. In case necessary, GCC along with other UK partners will provide assistance with the visa procedures.

#### **LOGISTICS:**

- The location of the workshop will be Glasgow, United Kingdom
- Expected arrival dates to Glasgow – 23rd of October 2016 IN THE MORNING / NOON TIME
- Departures should be scheduled on 28th of October IN THE AFTERNOON

Tutors are welcome to stay in Glasgow / United Kingdom longer. However, their expenses for additional time spent in UK beyond the time required for the workshop have to be borne by the participating members themselves. Both ISOCARP and ITACUS should timely be informed on such an extension. **PLEASE CONSULT YOUR TRAVEL PLANS IN ADVANCE WITH VP YPP Piotr Lorens.**

#### **ELIGIBILITY AND APPLICATION:**

Three Workshop Tutors will be selected among the applications. ISOCARP and ITACUS welcome applications from **full members** of either of the associations with proven expertise in planning / design practice and /or with academic experience and/or teaching experience in similar professional training programs. International experience is a plus but not a must. Also, the basic understanding and/or interest in urban design and provision of infrastructure for urban development will be treated as advantage. The most effective composition of the team will be taken into account for the final selection. **The final decision will be taken jointly by ISOCARP, ITACUS and GCC officials.**

#### **PLEASE PROVIDE THE FOLLOWING:**

1. A CLEAR statement of intent explaining why you want to apply. Please be specific and refer to prior workshop coordination or participation experience. (maximum 1 page)
2. A 2 page Curriculum Vitae/Resume pointing out the relevant experience
3. A selected list of publications and/or conference papers.
