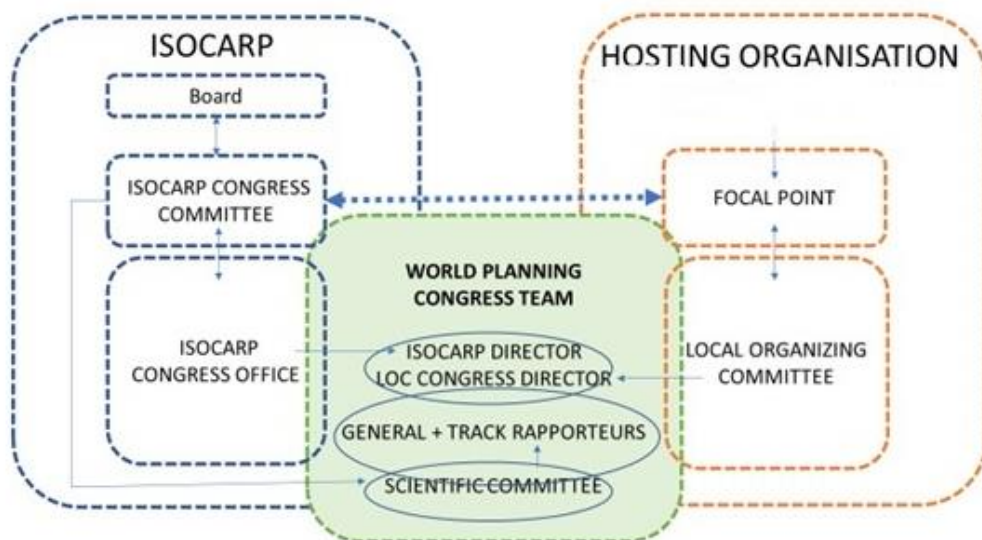

Full Financial Report with the Accounts 2019-2020 and Budget 2020-2021 is approved by the Board on 23 October 2020 and made available on the ISOCARP website.

Accounts 2019-2020

The financial year had a negative result of € - 60.000. Nevertheless, the present financial situation of ISOCARP is stable and safe. The loss is caused by 1) less and lower membership fees and 2) cancelled and postponed YPP and UPAT workshops due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This resulted in a smaller donation from the Institute than foreseen in the 2019-2020 budget. ISOCARP Society has received € 24.000 in COVID-19 relief funding from the government of The Netherlands in 2019-2020.

Budget 2020-2021

For 2020-2021 we expect that we will again have a negative result of € - 66.000 as the Board is convinced that for the future of ISOCARP and in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, we must invest in membership activities, a new website, a Communications Assistant and an Office Manager in support of the Congress Director. However, ISOCARP Society may expect to receive more COVID-19 relief funding in 2020-2021.

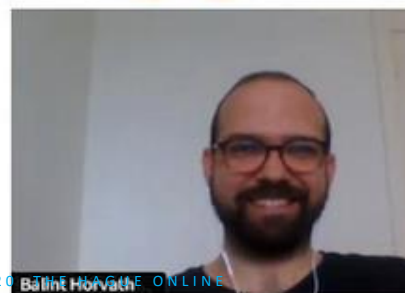

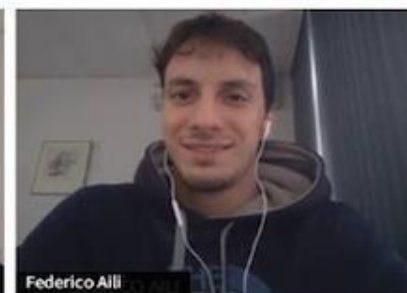

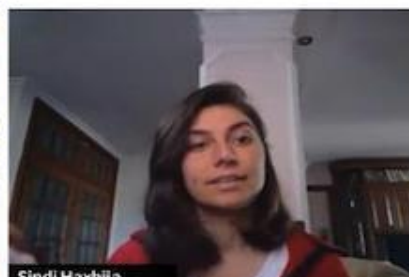
