## QU Press releases new book on housing and residential neighbourhoods in post-COVID era

QATAR University Press (QU Press) recently released a new book, 'Features of housing and residential neighborhoods in the post-COVID era' by Dr Ali Abdul Rauf, a professor of Architecture and Urban Planning and consultant in the Urban Planning Department at the Ministry of Municipality.

The book is the first in Arabic that deals with the topic of Arab and Gulf cities in the face of multiple challenges on how to formulate and plan urbanism to become more humane and safer cities from a health and

environmental point of view post-COVID-19.

The new book addresses the challenges of urban planning, especially as the pandemic develops into an urban crisis, which makes us reconsider the good shape of the city and the purpose of planning, and the pandemic provides an opportunity to reconsider the priorities of urban planning in the post-pandemic world.

The book deals with several research questions, including what are the lessons learned from the pre-COVID-19 pandemic? How can we expect cities to recover once the pandemic reaches its peak? Is there a

model for a city that resists the pandemic? How does the pandemic relate to issues of scale, urban size, social justice and resilience? When we are dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic or crises, emergency changes and escalating threats, should planners focus only on the physical form (size, shape, structure, density) and physical elements of the city such as infrastructure, buildings and open spaces only? Or should they also work on the economy, society, culture, governance and politics? What types of urban innovation can we expect or promote, based on the lessons learned during the COVID-19 pandemic crisis?

### ANNUAL ACCOUNT 2021-2022: Overview

In financial year 2021-2022, ISOCARP faced the negative result of **€ 63.557,52** the highest negative result in several previous years. ### ANNUAL ACCOUNT 2021-2022: Overview

In financial year 2021-2022, ISOCARP faced the negative result of **€ 63.557,52** the highest negative result in several previous years. Despite this, due to the healthy capital position at the start of the financial year (€ 86.404) that includes the continuity reserve of € 60.000 and the 58<sup>th</sup> WPC instalments, the negative result of € 63.557,52 could be absorbed.

The main reasons for such a negative result revolve around four issues:

1. lower than budgeted membership fees.
2. missing final instalment related to the 57<sup>th</sup> WPC congress in Doha,
3. zero 57<sup>th</sup> WPC sponsoring due to COVID-related uncertainties,
4. higher than budgeted operational expenses, and
5. lower than expected 'donations' from Institute.

## BUDGET 2022-2023

### BUDGET 2022-2023: Income

In total (including membership revenue of € 60.000), we estimate the income for ISOCARP in 2022-2023 to be **€ 280.380.**

In terms of income from the ISOCARP Programs and Activities to be € 205.380. This includes the revenues of the 58<sup>th</sup> ISOCARP World Planning Congress (estimated at € 189.000) and ISOCARP Awards (€ 21.480), as well as costs of preparing the Review of World Planning Practice, Volume 18 (€ 5.100).

The revenue from both the Awards and Reviews is significantly higher, as in 2022 the ISOCARP saw the absolute record number of entries received in the category Award for Excellence (30 entries in total), and the costs for the preparation of the Review were more than three times less than in previous years (decrease from € 16.355 to € 5.100).

In addition, we expect the projects, research and capacity building programmes will enable the ISOCARP Institute to contribute € 15.000 to ISOCARP Society.

## BUDGET 2022-2023

### BUDGET 2022-2023: Expenditures

The expected reservations and expenditures of the Society are divided into five segments:

- 1) Operations that includes staff € - 184.500,
- 2) Regional activities € - 5.000,
- 3) Administration € - 35.000,
- 4) Board meetings and Travel allowances are budgeted € -22.500, and
- 5) Depreciation, Bank Costs and Interest, and Unforeseen expenses are budgeted € - 8.550.

This results in the estimated total of expenditures **€ - 255.550.**

In sum, we expect the incomes of € 280.380 and the expenditures of € - 255.550 to result in a safe surplus of **€ 24.830** for 2022-2023.

**Abstract:** The COVID-19 pandemic has spurred significant changes in the fields of economic development, social issues, everyday life, etc. Activities that used to depend on face-to-face communication were firstly suspended and then shifted to new forms of communication. This includes the public participation process in urban and spatial planning. Therefore, this study explores the new domain developed in urban and spatial planning with regard to public participation and surmises future realms in the post-pandemic era. On the occasion of the virtual collaboration platform Cyber Agora organized by the ISOCARP (International Society of City and Regional Planners), chosen participants got together virtually to share, discuss, and compare their practical knowledge in public participation before and during COVID-19. In addition, they addressed the potential benefits of shifting from traditional to virtual participation and potential benefits in the post-COVID-19 era. Considering the collected data and understanding them in the light of the available literature, this study concludes that the application of a combined approach (using both traditional and virtual modes of participation) is recommended because it would enable a larger number and higher diversity of participants. The study also elaborates particular modes of virtual participation with the pros and cons of their
