

The themes allow for a global debate on the evolution and innovations of just cities and communities and a better consideration of climate action and urban economy as crucial components of better sustainable planning. Considering various spatial scales – from neighborhood to metropolitan, Volume 20 intends to cover an array of strategies, instruments, mechanisms, and design principles for improving the quality of life in the built environments across the globe. The publication aims to offer an array of evidence for improved planning practice, informed by and based upon various tools – from the shift in policymaking towards new modes of designing urban space.

Selection Process

Do you have an essay, research paper or a pioneering project which is ready to be published? Please fulfil the following form and send us your paper until September 20, 2024.

The process of selecting submissions for Review 20 will include two phases:

- In the first phase, ISOCARP members who are interested in having their contribution included in Review 20 are asked to submit a letter of interest including 300-500 words abstract, and a reference list of works related to the congress theme either theoretical or urban planning projects.
 - The deadline for this phase is 30th July 2024.
- In the second phase, the editorial team will select the best contributions and their authors will be asked to submit full articles.
 - o The deadline for this phase is September 20, 2024.
- All submissions will be further carefully reviewed and edited.

Publication Requirements

In case of your abstract is accepted, you will be asked to submit three separate files:

- 1. A text-only draft article which indicates where all graphics are to be placed.
- 2. The illustrations with captions and credits for the article.
- 3. Short bio (max. 150 words) and a photograph of each author.

The submission package should be sent to ISOCARP Review Editors at <u>isocarp-review@isocarp.org</u> and <u>alialraouf@isocarp.org</u>.

Publication Guidelines

Submitting Articles

Authors can submit articles in different categories include case studies analysis, project report, city experiences and research papers. Articles should be a between 2500 and 3500 words in length (More word count will be accepted for research papers). Submit your article as an editable Microsoft Word file. Do not lock or password-protect the file. Please begin your articles with its title. Below the title, type the names of the authors. Send us a text-only document with notations (e.g., "graphic 1 here") telling us where your graphics are to be inserted. Please do not include an abstract.

Headings should be numbered 1, 2, 3, etc. and subheadings 1.1, 1.2, 1.2.1, etc. to assist with the design process. These numbers will be removed before publication and replaced with heading styles consistent with the graphic design of the publication.

References in the Review are in the <u>Chicago Manual</u> and should be listed as endnotes. If you want the article to reference additional information, please include the https addresses for that information.

Please remember that <u>your article should tell a story</u>. In general, it should begin by providing the context for the project including a brief description of the place. Then it should highlight the main features of the project to end with a reflective section which discusses conclusions, recommendations, future steps, or revisions.

Please remember that majority of the readers of the *Review* are planning practitioners, but not necessarily experts in your field. Avoid using jargon and detailed technical discussions. You should strive to demonstrate how something works by using real world examples as well as by using illustrations or photos. You should avoid describing technical issues of how something works unless it is critical to your article.

Photos and Illustrations

The Review has a <u>very visual style</u>, more like a technical magazine than a scholarly journal. We encourage you to submit photos and illustrations which illustrate your words and tell a visual story. You should include location maps and site plans, 'before and after' photos, diagrams, charts, and images that reveal the character of the place or topic being discussed. They should assist the reader to follow the text.

We request that you submit at least a dozen high quality .JPEG images of your project. The resolution of photos and images should be not less than 300 dpi and we prefer much higher resolutions. One photo should be selected and identified as an introductory photo (eye catcher), which will appear at the beginning of the article. If you are submitting maps or illustrations, we recommend submitting an editable file (such as a vector or .psd/photoshop file) plus the high-quality jpeg/png/GIF - to match the format of Review.

<u>Please do not use photos or other graphics cut and pasted from another document or copied and pasted from Web sources.</u> These copied photos are too grainy to be published in the Review. Please only send copies of original actual photographs. In case of illustrations of graphs, tables and charts, we request you to send the .jpeg of the illustration. Please do not send Microsoft Publisher or AutoCAD files. In case of graphs and tables, we ask you to submit the jpeg of the graphic as well as editable files (such as Excel spreadsheet) which can be modified to match Review's layout.

<u>Please be sure to include a word document with photo credits.</u> If you are sending a photo taken by anyone other than one of the authors, please secure the permission of the owner before sending it to us.

In a separate Word Document <u>send captions for each illustration</u>.

We have had very good success sending large files of illustrations using free services such as WeTransfer or Dropbox. If you encounter difficulty, let us know so we can recommend alternative methods. If you have lots of illustrations and photos, send us more than your article needs. We will work with you to develop the best design for your article.

About the authors

Each author is asked to provide a short description of themselves (max. 150 words). Also include a photo of each author. Please send author photo(s) as a separate file; do not embed it into the Word document. Do not use cut and paste photos taken from other sources. A clear photo taken with a cell phone works just fine.

Submission

Please send all the requested submission material to the ISOCARP Editors to <u>isocarp-review@isocarp.org</u> and <u>alialraouf@isocarp.org</u> by September 20, 2024.

The deadline is strict, therefore we asked for almost ready to be published essays and projects reports. Also, the fact that the review must be launched during the ISOCARP WPC60 9-12 October 2024, puts more pressure on all of us and makes respecting the deadline essential matter.

As a continuation of ISOCARP Publication Program's Environmentally Friendly Policy, the book will be published in a digital format and will be available for members via ISOCARP website and social media platforms.

We thank you all so much for your valuable contributions and continues support for ISOCARP.
